Empowering lives in Kenya through Tana River Life Foundation

This year, PIL has once again contributed containers to the Tana River Life Foundation (TRLF), a charity in Kenya, Africa, to help in the shipping of used school furniture from Singapore to Kenya, in support of the education of children in rural Tana Delta in Kenya.

Mr Gabriel Teo, founder of TRLF and a Malaysian, was in Singapore for a few months this year and collected donations of used metal cabinets, metal lockers and classroom chairs from a number of schools in Singapore. He also received 50 refurbished laptops from Nanyang Technological University in Singapore as well as school stationaries and items such as scientific calculators and geometrical sets.

All these items, which were packed into three PIL containers, would be distributed across the 72 public primary schools and 17 public secondary schools supported by TRLF.

During his visit to Singapore this year, Mr Gabriel Teo met with Mr SS Teo, Executive Chairman of PIL.

PIL has been assisting TRLF with their annual shipments from Singapore since 2015. TRLF, founded by Mr Gabriel Teo in 2006, aims to provide quality and affordable education to children across Tana Delta in Kenya. The personal story of Mr Gabriel Teo, who gave up a promising career in Singapore to set up and run TRLF in Kenya, is one of great courage, compassion and sacrifice.
